## Objective

By the end of this lesson, the toddler will be able to identify and describe different aspects of dump trucks through reading and language activities.

## **Materials and Prep**

- A book about dump trucks
- Construction paper
- Markers or crayons
- Scissors
- Tape or glue

Before the lesson, familiarize yourself with the book and prepare the construction paper cutouts of dump trucks.

## Activities

- 1. Read the book about dump trucks to the toddler, emphasizing the illustrations and discussing the different parts of the dump truck.
- 2. After reading, ask the toddler to point to and name the different parts of the dump truck, such as the wheels, cab, and bed.
- 3. Using the construction paper cutouts, have the toddler create their own dump truck by coloring the cutouts and assembling them with tape or glue.
- 4. Encourage the toddler to describe their dump truck, using simple words and phrases to talk about the colors, shapes, and functions of each part.
- 5. Have a pretend play activity where the toddler can use their dump truck to transport small objects (e.g., blocks or toy cars) and verbally explain what they are doing.

## **Toddler Grade Talking Points**

- "Dump trucks are big trucks that can carry and transport heavy things."
- "They have a special bed that can go up and down to dump the things it carries."
- "Dump trucks have big wheels to help them move on different kinds of surfaces."
- "The driver sits in the front part of the truck called the cab."
- "Dump trucks are often seen at construction sites or places where things need to be moved."
