## **Objective**

By the end of this lesson, the student will be able to read and comprehend basic information about the United States.

## **Materials and Prep**

- A map of the United States
- A book about the United States
- Index cards
- Markers or colored pencils
- Scissors

## **Activities**

- 1. Start by showing the student a map of the United States. Ask them to identify the shape of the country and the location of different states.
- 2. Read the book about the United States together. Encourage the student to ask questions and discuss interesting facts they learn.
- 3. Prepare index cards with the names of different states written on them. Cut them into individual cards.
- 4. Ask the student to pick a card and read the name of the state. Then, have them locate the state on the map and color it in with markers or colored pencils.
- 5. Repeat the previous step with different states until the student feels comfortable identifying and locating them on the map.

## First Grade Talking Points

- "The United States is a big country with many states."
- "Each state has its own name and shape."
- "We can use a map to find and locate different states."
- "Reading the names of states helps us learn about the United States."
- "Coloring in the states on the map helps us remember where they are."
