Objective

By the end of this lesson, you will be able to successfully grow pumpkins and understand the process of pumpkin cultivation.

Materials and Prep

- Pumpkin seeds
- Potting soil
- Pots or containers
- Watering can or spray bottle
- Sunlight
- Access to a garden or outdoor space
