## Finding Your Own 'Thimble Summer'

Find one example from the book that shows Garnet being brave, resourceful, or thoughtful. Write down the page number and briefly explain the example. Discuss: How does Garnet grow or change by the end of the summer?

#### Part 3: Life on the Farm (Themes & Setting - 20 mins)

The story gives us a wonderful picture of life on a farm during the 1930s. What details about the setting stand out to you? (e.g., the drought, the daily chores, the community fair). How does this setting influence the story's events and what the characters do? Besides luck, what other important ideas or themes run through the book? Think about:

- The importance of family
- Hard work and perseverance (especially during the drought)
- Simple joys and adventures
- Community

Choose one theme and find a part of the story that illustrates it well. Share your thoughts.

# Part 4: Your 'Thimble Summer' Moment (Creative Response - 15 mins)

Garnet's summer was special because of unexpected events and simple pleasures. Now it's your turn to be creative! Choose ONE of these options:

- 1. Draw your favorite scene from 'Thimble Summer'.
- 2. Write a short journal entry from Garnet's perspective about one of her adventures (like arriving at the fair or meeting Citronella).
- Design your own 'lucky charm' like the thimble. Sketch it and explain why it might bring good fortune.
