Welcome, Super Reader! Let's Explore Ivan's World!

Project Materials:

Step 3: Uncovering the Big Ideas (Themes)

'The One and Only Ivan' is packed with important messages. What do you think the book teaches us about:

- Home and belonging?
- The meaning of friendship?
- Keeping promises?
- Hope, even in difficult situations?
- How humans treat animals?
- The power of art or expressing yourself?

Choose 1-2 themes that resonated most with you. Find examples from the book that support these ideas.

Step 4: Choose Your Book Report Adventure!

This isn't just any book report. Choose a fun way to share what you've learned:

- 1. **Classic Written Report:** Write a 3-5 paragraph essay analyzing a key theme or character arc. Include an introduction, body paragraphs with text evidence, and a conclusion.
- 2. Character Diary: Write several diary entries from the perspective of Ivan, Ruby, or Julia,

capturing key moments and their feelings.

- 3. **Newspaper Article:** Imagine you're a reporter covering Ivan's story. Write an article detailing the events at the Big Top Mall and Ivan's eventual move. Include quotes (you can create realistic ones based on the characters).
- 4. **Comic Book Summary:** Retell the main plot points and character interactions through a series of comic panels with illustrations and dialogue/narration.
- 5. 'Ivan's Promise' Presentation: Create a short presentation (using slides or posters) focusing on the theme of promises in the book, especially Ivan's promise to Stella. Explain why it's important and how he fulfills it.

Step 5: Plan and Draft

Outline your chosen project. What information needs to go where? Gather your notes, quotes, and theme ideas. Start drafting! Don't worry about perfection yet, just get your ideas down.

Step 6: Polish and Present

Read through your draft. Check for:

- Clear explanations
- Good supporting evidence/examples from the book
- Correct spelling and grammar
- Engaging language

Make any necessary revisions. Prepare your final version based on the format you chose. Be ready to share and discuss your fantastic work!
