## **Objective**

By the end of this lesson, you will be able to identify and describe basic shapes in relation to Paddington Bear.

## **Materials and Prep**

- Paper and pencil
- Paddington Bear book or toy

## **Activities**

- 1. Introduction to Shapes: Start by showing the student the Paddington Bear book or toy. Ask them to identify the shapes they see on Paddington Bear. Discuss the different shapes they notice, such as circles for the bear's face, rectangles for his body, and triangles for his hat.
- 2. Shape Hunt: Give the student a piece of paper and ask them to go on a shape hunt around the house.
