

Materials Needed:

- World Map (historical or modern)
- Paper (plain and/or blue construction paper)
- Crayons, colored pencils, or markers
- Optional: Computer/tablet with internet access (for viewing Blox Fruits maps or researching explorers)
- Optional: Small items for 'trade goods' (like beans, beads, small toys)

Ahoy, Explorer! Blox Fruits and the Real Age of Discovery!

You love exploring the seas, finding islands, and getting powerful fruits in Blox Fruits, right? Guess what? Hundreds of years ago, real explorers sailed across giant oceans, discovered new lands, and faced incredible adventures, kind of like in the game!

Activity 1: Charting the Seas - Game vs. Reality

In Blox Fruits, you sail between the First Sea, Second Sea, and Third Sea, discovering islands like Pirate Starter Island or the Kingdom of Rose. Let's look at a real world map. Can you find the huge oceans like the Atlantic and Pacific? Real explorers like Christopher Columbus and Ferdinand Magellan had to figure out how to cross these vast waters without GPS, just stars and a compass!

Task: Look at the world map. Point out the major oceans. Now, imagine you're a Blox Fruits character. Draw a simple map of your own 'sea' with a few islands. What would you name your islands? What dangers or treasures might be there?

Activity 2: Famous Explorers - The Original Fruit Seekers?

Explorers weren't looking for Devil Fruits, but they *were* searching for valuable things! Some wanted gold and silver (like treasure!), others sought spices (which were worth a lot of money), new trade routes (like finding a faster way to the 'Third Sea'), or claimed land for their King or Queen (like different factions controlling islands).

Task: Let's learn about one famous explorer, like Ferdinand Magellan. He was the first to lead a voyage that sailed all the way around the world! What challenges do you think his crew faced? (Hint: Think storms, running out of food, maybe unfriendly welcomes on islands!) How is that similar to trying to level up or defeat a boss in Blox Fruits?

Activity 3: Trade Routes and Territory

When explorers found new places, they often set up trade routes. This means ships would travel back and forth, bringing goods like silk, spices, or tools from one part of the world to another. Sometimes, different countries (like different crews or factions in Blox Fruits) would fight over control of these routes or territories.

Task: Let's use our small items as 'trade goods'. Imagine one side of the room is Europe and the other side is Asia. Use blue paper to make an ocean path (your trade route). How would you safely get your 'goods' across? What if another 'crew' (maybe a family member!) tried to block your path?

Wrap-up: History is an Adventure!
