### **Materials Needed**

## **Fortnite Grammar Gauntlet!**

Hey Squad Leader! Ever notice how clear communication wins Victory Royales in Fortnite? Knowing exactly what someone means when they shout, 'He's gliding **quickly** towards the **tall** tower!' can make all the difference. That's where grammar comes in! Today, we're diving into the building blocks of sentences – **Parts of Speech** – using the world of Fortnite.

#### Meet the Squad: Parts of Speech

Think of parts of speech like different roles on your Fortnite team:

- Nouns: The 'Players' and 'Places'. These are words for people, places, things, or ideas. (Examples: Jonesy, Tilted Towers, Chug Jug, Victory Royale)
- **Verbs:** The 'Actions'. These words show action or a state of being. (Examples: **builds**, **shoots**, **qlides**, **is**, **hides**)
- **Adjectives:** The 'Describers' for Nouns. These words describe nouns. (Examples: **legendary** Scar, **stormy** weather, **quick** escape, **blue** shield potion)
- Adverbs: The 'Describers' for Verbs (and Adjectives/Other Adverbs). These often tell \*how\*, \*when\*, or \*where\* an action happens. Many end in '-ly'. (Examples: runs quickly, builds skillfully, landed safely, almost eliminated)

# **Activity 1: Storm Surge Sentences**

Let's analyze some battle reports! Read these sentences. Identify the Nouns (N), Verbs (V), Adjectives (Adj), and Adverbs (Adv). We can write them on the whiteboard.

- 1. The **skilled**(Adj) player(N) **quickly**(Adv) built(V) a **strong**(Adj) fort(N).
- Peely(N) ran(V) wildly(Adv) from the approaching(Adj) storm(N).
- 3. A rare(Adj) chest(N) contained(V) powerful(Adj) weapons(N).
- 4. She(N) landed(V) quietly(Adv) at Stealthy Stronghold(N).
- 5. The **final**(Adj) opponent(N) was(V) **surprisingly**(Adv) easy(Adj).

#### **Activity 2: Loot Drop Descriptions**

Imagine you just opened a Supply Drop! Describe what you found or what happens next. Write 3-5 sentences. Focus on using strong verbs and descriptive adjectives and adverbs. For example:

Instead of: 'I got a gun.'

*Try:* 'I **luckily**(Adv) found(V) a **golden**(Adj) Tactical Shotgun(N) inside the **heavy**(Adj) Supply Drop(N). I **immediately**(Adv) equipped(V) it.'

Share your sentences and we'll identify the parts of speech together!
