

## Objective

By the end of this lesson, the student will be able to analyze and discuss the representation of disabilities in literature, identify common themes and motifs related to disabilities, and demonstrate an understanding of the impact of disabilities on characters and their stories.

## Materials and Prep

- Access to a library or online resources for reading materials
- Paper and pen for note-taking
- Computer or tablet for research and discussion

## Activities

1. Introduce the topic of disabilities in literature and discuss the importance of representation. Encourage the student to share any personal experiences or thoughts on the subject.
2. Choose a book or short story that prominently features a character with a disability. Provide the student with a copy of the text or guide them to an online version.
