Objective

By the end of this lesson, the student will be able to utilize library skills to research and gather information about the Roman Empire.

Materials and Prep

- · Access to a library or online resources
- Paper and pencil

Activities

- 1. Introduction: Start by discussing the student's interest in the Roman Empire and why they want to learn more about it. Encourage them to share any prior knowledge they may have.
