Objective

By the end of this lesson, the homeschool student will be able to analyze the historical context of "The Rat Catcher's Daughter" and demonstrate their understanding through a writing activity.

Materials and Prep

- Copy of the book "The Rat Catcher's Daughter"
- Pen or pencil
- Notebook or loose-leaf paper

Prior knowledge: Basic understanding of the plot and characters in "The Rat Catcher's Daughter".

Activities

- 1. Start by reviewing the main events and characters in "The Rat Catcher's Daughter". Discuss any questions or confusion the student may have.
