Objective

By the end of this lesson, you will be able to appreciate and analyze the artwork in "baddawi" by Leila Abdelrazaq, and understand its cultural significance.

Materials and Prep

- Computer or tablet with internet access
- Printed or digital copy of "baddawi" by Leila Abdelrazaq

Activities
