Objective

By the end of this lesson, the student will be able to analyze and summarize the life and writings of Samuel Pepys, demonstrating an understanding of his significance in British history.

Materials and Prep

- Pen and paper
- Access to the internet or books about Samuel Pepys

Activities

- 1. Begin by introducing Samuel Pepys and his importance in British history. Discuss his role as a diarist and his eyewitness accounts of significant events such as the Great Fire of London.
