Objective

By the end of this lesson, you will be able to explore the concepts of geography through the lens of the interstellar movie.

Materials and Prep

- Computer or tablet with internet access
- Paper and pen/pencil
- · Access to the interstellar movie

Activities

- Activity 1: Interstellar World Map
 Create a world map based on the interstellar movie. Identify and label different planets and
 locations mentioned or visited in the movie. Use your creativity to design the map, and include
 key details from the movie.
- Activity 2: Planet Research
 Choose one of the planets mentioned in the interstellar movie and conduct research on its geography. Find information about its size, climate, natural features, and any other interesting facts. Create a presentation or poster to share your findings with others.
- Activity 3: Journey to Space Imagine you are going on a journey to space. Plan your interstellar voyage by selecting a destination from the movie and mapping out the route you would take. Consider the distance, time, and resources required for the journey. Present your plan to the class.

Talking Points

- Geography is not only limited to Earth, but can also be explored in the context of other planets and celestial bodies.
- The interstellar movie takes us on a journey through space, showcasing different planets and their unique characteristics.
