

Objective

By the end of this lesson, the student will be able to analyze and discuss the themes and literary elements in the movie Interstellar.

Materials and Prep

- Access to the movie Interstellar
- Pen and paper for note-taking
- Optional: Internet access for further research

Activities

- Watch the movie Interstellar and take notes on key plot points, characters, and any literary elements that stand out.
- After watching the movie, write a brief summary of the main themes you noticed and discuss them with a family member or friend.
- Choose one of the characters from the movie and create a character analysis. Include their motivations, conflicts, and how they contribute to the overall story.

Talking Points
