Objective

By the end of this lesson, you will be able to recognize and read sight words.

Materials and Prep

- Flashcards with sight words (create your own or use printable resources)
- Whiteboard or paper and markers

Activities

1. Word Recognition Game:

Show the flashcards one by one and ask the student to read the sight word aloud. Repeat this activity until the student becomes familiar with all the sight words.

2. Writing Practice:

Write each sight word on the whiteboard or paper. Ask the student to trace the word with their finger and then write it themselves. Encourage them to say the word aloud as they write.

3. Sight Word Hunt:

Hide the flashcards around the room or in a designated area. Ask the student to find the flashcards one by one and read the sight words aloud as they find them.

Talking Points

- "Today, we are going to learn about sight words. Sight words are words that we see a lot when we read."
- "Sight words are important because they help us read faster and understand sentences better."
- "Let's play a game! I will show you a flashcard with a sight word, and I want you to read it out loud."
- "Great job! Now, let's practice writing these sight words. I will write a word, and you can trace it with your finger and then try writing it yourself."
- "Now, let's go on a sight word hunt! I have hidden some flashcards around the room. Can you find them and read the sight words aloud?"
- "Well done! You are becoming a sight word expert! Keep practicing these words, and soon you will be reading even more exciting stories!"
