

Objective

By the end of this lesson, the student will be able to understand and analyze various aspects of World War II through reading and discussion.

Materials and Prep

- World War II books or online resources
- Pen and paper for note-taking
- Computer or tablet for research (optional)

Before starting the lesson, the student should have a basic understanding of World War II and its major events.

Activities
