Objective

By the end of this lesson, the student will have a basic understanding of the Korean War, including its causes, major events, and impact.

Materials and Prep

- Internet access
- Pen and paper
- Optional: Books or documentaries about the Korean War

No prior knowledge is required for this lesson.

Activities

1. Research the Korean War

Encourage the student to use the internet or books to find information about the Korean War. They can take notes on important facts and events.

2. Create a timeline

Ask the student to create a timeline of the major events of the Korean War. They can draw or write the events in chronological order.

3. Write a journal entry

Talking Points
