By the end of this lesson, the student will be able to understand the history and significance of the Korean Bell of Friendship.

Materials and Prep

Activities

Talking Points

- "The bell is rung on special occasions and festivals, and the sound is believed to bring blessings and good fortune."
- "The Korean Bell of Friendship is a significant cultural landmark and serves as a reminder of the strong bond between the two nations."
