## **Objective**

By the end of this lesson, the student will have a better understanding of the Doctor Who episode "Doomsday" and its significance in the series.

## **Materials and Prep**

- A computer or TV with access to the Doctor Who episode "Doomsday"
- Pen and paper for note-taking
- Prior knowledge of the Doctor Who series

## **Activities**

- Watch the Doctor Who episode "Doomsday" together
- Discuss the major plot points and character developments
- Engage in a group or individual analysis of the episode
- Create a character profile for the Doctor and Rose Tyler
- Write a short fanfiction or alternate ending for the episode

## **Talking Points**

- The Doctor and Rose's Relationship: Discuss the bond between the Doctor and Rose Tyler, focusing on their emotional connection and how it evolves throughout the episode. You can say, "The Doctor and Rose have a special relationship. They care deeply for each other, and their bond is tested in 'Doomsday'."

You can say, "'Doomsday' is a very emotional episode. It deals with themes of loss and sacrifice. It shows us that even the Doctor, who is usually so confident, can make mistakes and face devastating consequences."
- The Importance of Goodbyes: Explore the significance of the farewell scene between the Doctor and Rose. Discuss the emotions involved and the impact it has on both characters. You can say, "The goodbye scene between the Doctor and Rose is a powerful moment. It shows us the importance of saying goodbye and how it can be both heartbreaking and necessary."
- The Impact on the Doctor: Talk about how the events of "Doomsday" affect the Doctor's character and future adventures. Discuss the consequences of his actions and how they shape his journey. You can say, "The events of 'Doomsday' have a lasting impact on the Doctor. It changes him and influences his future adventures. It's a turning point in the series."
