Objective

By the end of this lesson, the student will be able to practice handwriting skills using a graphic novel theme.

Materials and Prep

- Plain paper or lined paper
- Pencils or pens
- Graphic novels or comic books for reference

No prior knowledge or preparation is required for this lesson.

Activities

- Create a Comic Strip: Have the student create their own mini graphic novel by drawing a comic strip with 3-4 panels. Encourage them to come up with a simple story or scenario and illustrate it using their best handwriting.
- Character Handwriting Practice: Ask the student to choose a favorite character from a graphic novel or comic book. They can then practice writing the character's name or a short sentence using the character's speech bubble as a guide.
- Design a Book Cover: Have the student design a book cover for their own graphic novel. They can write the title of the book, their name as the author, and draw an eye-catching illustration on the cover. Encourage them to use their best handwriting for the text.

Talking Points

- "Today, we are going to practice our handwriting skills while having fun with a graphic novel theme."
- "We will be using graphic novels and comic books as inspiration for our handwriting practice."
- "In the first activity, we will create our own mini graphic novel by drawing a comic strip with 3-4 panels. We will use our best handwriting to write the story or dialogue in each panel."
- "For the second activity, we will choose a favorite character from a graphic novel and practice writing their name or a short sentence using the character's speech bubble as a guide."
- "In the last activity, we will design a book cover for our own graphic novel. We will write the title, our name as the author, and draw an eye-catching illustration on the cover. Let's make sure to use our best handwriting for the text."
