Objective

By the end of this lesson, the student will be able to understand the basics of the Stone Age and its significance in history.

Materials and Prep

- Internet access or books about the Stone Age
- Paper and pencils

Activities

• Activity 1: Research the Stone Age

Talking Points

- In the Neolithic period, people began to practice agriculture and started farming. This allowed them to produce more food and establish permanent settlements.
- Stone Age people used different types of tools for various purposes. For example, they used

spears for hunting animals, axes for cutting trees, and scrapers for preparing animal hides. • Life during the Stone Age was challenging, but people were resourceful and adapted to their surroundings. They developed techniques to make fire, create shelters, and communicate with each other.
