Objective

By the end of this lesson, the student will be able to understand the life and accomplishments of Martin Luther King Jr. through various reading activities.

Materials and Prep

- Books or articles about Martin Luther King Jr.
- Pen or pencil
- Plain paper or notebook

Activities

- 1. Read a book or article about Martin Luther King Jr. aloud together.
- 2. Ask the student to write a short summary of what they learned from the reading. Encourage them to include at least three key points or facts.
- 3. Have the student create a timeline of important events in Martin Luther King Jr.'s life. They can draw or write about each event and include the corresponding year.
- 4. Engage in a discussion about the impact Martin Luther King Jr. had on civil rights and equality. Encourage the student to share their thoughts and ask questions.
- 5. Ask the student to imagine they are Martin Luther King Jr. and write a short speech about their dreams for a better world. They can include ideas about equality, justice, and peace.
