

## Objective

By the end of this lesson, the student will be able to understand the key events, countries involved, and impact of World War II.

## Materials and Prep

- Pen and paper
- Access to a computer or library for research
- World War II books or online resources

## Activities

### 1. Create a Timeline:

Ask the student to create a timeline of the major events of World War II. They can start from the beginning of the war and include key battles, important dates, and significant turning points. Encourage them to use visuals and captions to make it more engaging.

### 2. Research and Present:

Have the student choose a country involved in World War II and research its role in the war. They can create a presentation or a written report highlighting the country's contributions, challenges, and impact on the outcome of the war. Encourage them to use images and maps to enhance their presentation.

### 3. Interview a Veteran:
