Objective

By the end of this lesson, the student will be able to enhance their reading skills while exploring their interest in horses.

Materials and Prep

Activities

- Activity 3: Creative Writing Imagine you are a horse. Write a short story or poem from the perspective of a horse. Include details about your daily life, feelings, and experiences.
- Activity 4: Research Project Choose a specific horse breed or a famous horse and research its
 history, characteristics, and notable achievements. Create a poster or presentation to share
 your findings.

Talking Points
