Objective

By the end of this lesson, the student will be able to understand the basic geography of Mesopotamia and identify key features and characteristics of this ancient civilization.

Materials and Prep

- World map or globe
- Blank paper and coloring materials
- Pencil

No prior knowledge or preparation is required for this lesson.

Activities

- Create a Mesopotamia Map: Provide the student with a blank piece of paper and ask them to draw a map of Mesopotamia. Encourage them to include important geographical features such as rivers, cities, and mountains.
- Coloring Activity: Give the student a coloring page featuring Mesopotamian landmarks, such as the Ziggurat or Hanging Gardens of Babylon. Let them color the page while discussing the significance of these structures.
- Storytelling: Read a simplified story about life in ancient Mesopotamia. Discuss the daily life, food, clothing, and transportation of the people living in this civilization.

Talking Points

- "Mesopotamia was a very old civilization that existed thousands of years ago."
- "It was located in the region we now know as the Middle East, between two rivers called the Tigris and Euphrates rivers."
- "The people of Mesopotamia built cities and created their own system of writing called cuneiform."
- "They were skilled farmers and grew crops like barley and wheat."
- "The people of Mesopotamia built tall structures called ziggurats, which were like temples."
- "They also had beautiful gardens, known as the Hanging Gardens of Babylon."
- "The rivers were very important for transportation and trade in Mesopotamia."
