Activities

Talking Points

- WWE was founded in 1952 by Jess McMahon and Toots Mondt. It was initially known as Capitol Wrestling Corporation (CWC) and later became the World Wrestling Federation (WWF) before rebranding as WWE in 2002.
- WrestleMania is WWE's biggest annual event. It started in 1985 and has become a showcase for legendary matches and moments in wrestling history.

- WWE has had many iconic superstars over the years, such as Hulk Hogan, The Rock, Stone Cold Steve Austin, John Cena, and more. These superstars have become household names and have had a significant impact on popular culture.
- WWE has various championships, including the WWE Championship, Universal Championship, Intercontinental Championship, and Women's Championship. These titles are contested in matches to determine the champions.
