

## Objective

By the end of this lesson, the student will be able to improve their reading skills while learning about ball hockey and its vocabulary.

## Materials and Prep

- Ball hockey book or online resources
- Pen or pencil
- Blank paper

## Activities

1. **Reading Comprehension:** Have the student read a ball hockey book or an online article about ball hockey. After reading, ask them questions to check their understanding. For example, "What is ball hockey?" or "What equipment is used in ball hockey?"
