By the end of this lesson, you will be able to define the key events of the Pacific Theatre of World War II.

Materials and Prep

Activities

- Create a Timeline:

Talking Points

- "The Pacific Theatre of World War II refers to the conflict between the Allies (primarily the United States) and Japan in the Pacific Ocean and surrounding areas."
- "The attack on Pearl Harbor on December 7, 1941, by the Japanese was a significant event that led to the United States' entry into World War II."
- "The Battle of Midway, which took place from June 4-7, 1942, was a turning point in the Pacific Theatre. The United States successfully repelled a Japanese attack, causing heavy losses for the Japanese navy."
- "The Battle of Guadalcanal, fought from August 1942 to February 1943, was the first major offensive by Allied forces against the Japanese. It was a crucial victory that marked the beginning of the Island Hopping strategy."
- "The Battle of Iwo Jima, which occurred from February 19 to March 26, 1945, was a fierce battle between the United States and Japan. It resulted in a strategic victory for the United States, but at a high cost in terms of casualties."
- "The Battle of Okinawa, fought from April 1 to June 22, 1945, was one of the bloodiest battles in the Pacific Theatre. It was a precursor to the planned invasion of Japan, but also demonstrated the tenacity of Japanese resistance."
