Objective

By the end of this lesson, you will be able to analyze the characters and plot of Alex Rider Stormbreaker and write a creative short story inspired by the book.

Materials and Prep

- Copy of Alex Rider Stormbreaker
- Pen or pencil
- Notebook or loose-leaf paper

Activities

- **Character Analysis:** Choose one of the characters from Alex Rider Stormbreaker and write a character analysis. Describe their physical appearance, personality traits, and their role in the story. Use evidence from the book to support your analysis.
- **Plot Summary:** Write a brief summary of the plot of Alex Rider Stormbreaker. Include the main events and the conflict faced by the protagonist. Be sure to use your own words and avoid spoilers.
- Alternate Ending: Imagine an alternative ending for the book. Write a short story that continues the story from where the original book ends. Be creative and think about how your ending would change the overall outcome of the story.

• Character Analysis:

- "Focus on the key events that move the story forward and the challenges faced by the protagonist."
- Alternate Ending:
 - $\circ\,$ "An alternate ending allows you to explore different possibilities for how the story could have concluded."
 - $\circ\,$ "Think about how your ending would change the outcome of the story and how it would affect the characters."
 - $\circ\,$ "Be creative and have fun with your alternate ending, but make sure it's still connected to the events and themes of the original book."
