Objective

By the end of this lesson, you will be able to improve your writing skills by exploring the world of Bungo Stray Dogs and creating your own story inspired by the characters and themes.

Materials and Prep

- Pen or pencil
- Blank paper or notebook
- Access to Bungo Stray Dogs resources (books, anime, manga, etc.)

Activities

- 4. Theme Exploration: Identify a theme or message that is prevalent in Bungo Stray Dogs (e.g., friendship, justice, identity). Write a reflective essay discussing how this theme is portrayed in the series and how it resonates with you personally.

Talking Points

- Introduction to Bungo Stray Dogs: "Bungo Stray Dogs is a popular anime and manga series that combines supernatural powers with literary references. It features a group of characters with unique abilities, known as the Armed Detective Agency, who solve mysterious cases. The characters are named after famous authors and their abilities are inspired by their literary works."

- **Dialogue Practice:** "Dialogue is an essential part of storytelling. Pay attention to each character's speech patterns, vocabulary, and tone. Think about how they would interact with each other based on their personalities and relationships. You can create a dialogue that is funny, serious, or even emotional."
- **Theme Exploration:** "Themes are underlying messages or ideas that can be found in a story. In Bungo Stray Dogs, themes like friendship, justice, and identity are prevalent. Reflect on how these themes are portrayed in the series and how they connect with your own experiences and values."
