## Objective

By the end of this lesson, the 4-year-old homeschool student will have gained knowledge and understanding of garbage trucks, while also developing skills in Art, English, Foreign Language, History, Math, Music, Physical Education, Science, and Social Studies.

## **Materials and Prep**

- Toy garbage truck
- Paper and crayons/markers
- Books about garbage trucks
- Access to a computer or tablet
- Optional: Garbage truck videos or documentaries

## Activities

- Create a garbage truck drawing: Encourage the student to draw their own garbage truck using paper and crayons/markers. They can get creative and add details like wheels, a driver, and garbage bins.
- Read books about garbage trucks: Choose age-appropriate books that provide information and fun facts about garbage trucks. Discuss the illustrations and ask the student questions about what they've learned.
- Watch videos or documentaries: Show the student videos or documentaries about garbage trucks. This will help them visualize how garbage trucks work and the role they play in keeping the environment clean.
- Learn counting with garbage bins: Set up a small obstacle course using toy garbage bins. Ask the student to count the number of bins they pass as they navigate through the course. This activity incorporates math skills and physical movement.
- Garbage truck language learning: Teach the student a few useful phrases related to garbage trucks in a foreign language of your choice. For example, "garbage truck" in Spanish is "camión de basura". Practice saying these phrases together.

## **Talking Points**

- Art: "Let's draw our own garbage trucks! What colors should we use? Can you add a driver to your drawing?"
- English: "Garbage trucks help keep our neighborhoods clean. Can you say 'garbage truck'?"
- Foreign Language: "In Spanish, 'garbage truck' is called 'camión de basura'. Can you say it?"
- History: "Garbage trucks have been around for a long time. They have changed a lot over the years. Can you imagine what garbage trucks looked like a long time ago?"
- Math: "Let's count the number of garbage bins we see in the book. Can you count them with me?"
- Music: "Garbage trucks make different sounds. Can you make a sound like a garbage truck? What other sounds can you make?"
- Physical Education: "Let's pretend to be garbage trucks and move around the room. Can you make beeping sounds like a garbage truck backing up?"
- Science: "Garbage trucks help keep our environment clean. They collect trash and take it to a special place called a landfill. Do you know what happens to the trash in a landfill?"
- Social Studies: "Garbage trucks are part of our community. They help keep our neighborhoods clean. Can you think of other people or things that are part of our community?"
