

Objective

By the end of this lesson, the student will be able to understand the concept of the Pyramid of Egypt and its significance in history.

Materials and Prep

- Pen and paper
- Printed pictures or drawings of pyramids
- Optional: Books or online resources about pyramids

Activities

- Activity 1: Drawing Pyramids

Ask the student to draw a pyramid on a piece of paper. Encourage them to be creative and add details to their drawing. Discuss the shape and structure of pyramids while they draw.

- Activity 2: Pyramid Building

Using building blocks or any other available materials, ask the student to build a small pyramid. Guide them in stacking the blocks in a pyramid shape. Discuss the purpose and function of pyramids while they build.

- Activity 3: Pyramid Puzzle

Create a simple pyramid puzzle by cutting out different-sized triangles from cardboard or paper. Mix up the pieces and ask the student to assemble them to form a pyramid. This activity will help them understand the structure of pyramids.

Talking Points

- Pyramids are ancient structures built by the Egyptians thousands of years ago.
- They were built as tombs for pharaohs, who were the rulers of ancient Egypt.
- Pyramids are made of large stone blocks stacked on top of each other.
- The shape of a pyramid is like a triangle with a square base.
- Pyramids were built to protect the pharaoh's body and belongings for the afterlife.
- Inside pyramids, there are secret passages and chambers where the pharaoh's body and treasures were placed.
