## **Objective**

By the end of this lesson, the student will have a better understanding of Viking history, culture, and their impact on society.

## **Materials and Prep**

- Internet access
- Pen and paper

No prior knowledge is necessary, but a general understanding of European history would be helpful.

## **Activities**

- Research and create a Viking timeline: The student will use online resources to research and create a timeline highlighting important events in Viking history. They should include significant dates, notable Viking figures, and major Viking expeditions.
- Design a Viking artifact: The student will imagine themselves as a Viking craftsman and design a Viking artifact such as a weapon, jewelry, or a household item. They should draw or sketch their design and explain its purpose and significance.

## **Talking Points**
