Objective

By the end of this lesson, the student will have a basic understanding of Canadian law and its importance in society.

Materials and Prep

- Computer with internet access
- Pen and paper
- Access to a library or online resources

Activities

Activity 1: Research Canadian Law

Have the student use the internet or library resources to research the Canadian legal system. They should focus on understanding the structure of the legal system, key legal principles, and the role of different courts and legal professionals.

Activity 2: Case Study Analysis

Select a real-life Canadian legal case that interests the student. Provide them with the details of the case, including the parties involved, the legal issues at hand, and the final decision. Ask the student to analyze the case, considering the arguments presented by each side and the reasoning behind the court's decision.

• Activity 3: Mock Trial

Have the student participate in a mock trial, either by themselves or with family members. Assign roles such as judge, prosecutor, defense attorney, and witnesses. Use a fictional case or adapt a real-life case to fit the scenario. The student should research and prepare their role, present arguments, and cross-examine witnesses.
