Objective

By the end of this lesson, you will be able to analyze and discuss the themes and characters in the book Blueback by Tim Winton.

Materials and Prep

- Copy of the book Blueback by Tim Winton
- Pen/pencil and notebook

Activities

- 1. Reading Comprehension: Read the first chapter of Blueback independently. Take notes on the main characters and any important events that occur.
- 2. Character Analysis: Choose one character from the book and create a character profile. Include details about their appearance, personality traits, and their role in the story.
- 3. Theme Exploration: Identify the main themes in the book. Write a short paragraph explaining how these themes are developed throughout the story.
- 4. Discussion: Find a family member or friend who has also read Blueback. Have a conversation about your favorite parts of the book, the characters you liked/disliked, and any important lessons you learned.

Talking Points
