Read through the following sections about creation in Christianity, then answer the questions that follow.

The Creation Story

In Christianity, the creation story is found in the Book of Genesis, which opens the Bible. According to Genesis, God created the world in six days and rested on the seventh. Here's a brief overview:

- Day 1: God created light, separating it from darkness.
- Day 2: God created the sky and separated the waters above from the waters below.
- Day 3: God gathered the waters together and made dry land appear. He created vegetation.
- Day 4: God created the sun, moon, and stars to give light to the earth.
- Day 5: God created sea creatures and birds.
- Day 6: God created land animals and humans in His own image.
- Day 7: God rested, declaring His creation "very good."

Key Concepts

1. **Imago Dei**: This concept means 'Image of God' and refers to humans being created in God's likeness.
2. **Stewardship**: The belief that humans have a responsibility to take care of God's creation.
3. **Sabbath**: The rest on the seventh day is a reminder of the importance of rest and worship.

Reflection Questions

1. What do you think is the most important part of the creation story? Why?

2. How can understanding the creation story influence the way you treat the environment?

3. Which day of creation do you find the most interesting, and how does it connect to your life today?

Additional Activity

Imagine you are creating your own version of the world in just 3 days. Describe what you would create and why.
