Types of Hooks

- **Question Hook:** Begins with a thought-provoking question.
- **Quote Hook:** Uses a quote from a famous person that relates to the topic.
- **Statistic Hook:** Starts with an interesting fact or statistic.
- **Story Hook:** Begins with a brief anecdote to draw in the reader.
