Read the following questions and answer them based on your understanding of "Anne of Green Gables." Use complete sentences and provide examples when necessary.

Comprehension Questions

1. Describe how Anne's imagination influences her daily life. Can you give an example from the story?
2. What challenges does Anne face when she first arrives at Green Gables? How does she respond to these challenges?
3. Discuss the relationship between Anne and Marilla. How does it develop throughout the story?
4. Identify a key turning point in the story. What events lead up to it, and how does it affect Anne's character?
