Part 4: Short Answer

(Answers will vary. A sample answer is provided below.)

Sample Answer: The Tropical Rainforest and the Temperate Deciduous Forest are similar because both biomes are dominated by trees. However, they are different in their climate and type of trees. The tropical rainforest is hot and wet all year with broad-leaved evergreen trees, while the temperate forest has four seasons and is known for deciduous trees that lose their leaves in the winter.
