

## Instructions

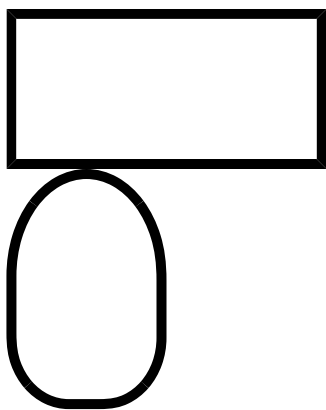

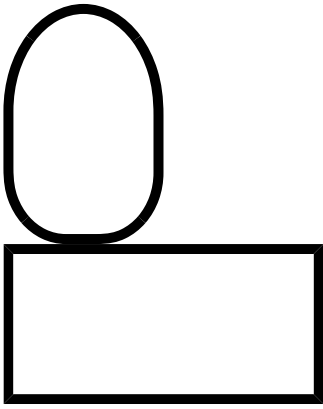
### Mozart's Music Note



### Match the Instruments

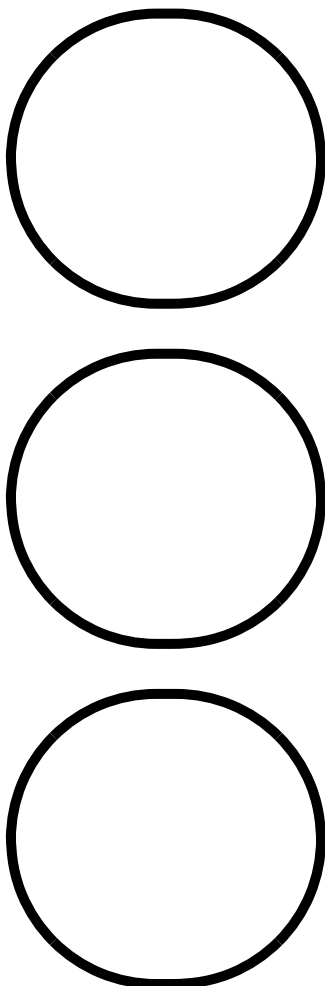
Mozart used instruments like the piano and violin. Draw a line from the instrument on the left to its matching partner on the right.

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## Answer Key

**Mozart's Music Note:** The child can color the note any way they choose. This is for creative expression.

**Match the Instruments:**

- A line should be drawn from the rectangle (piano) on the left to the rectangle (piano) on the right.
- A line should be drawn from the curved shape (violin) on the left to the curved shape (violin) on the right.

**My Listening Chart:** The child should color one circle for each listening session. There is no wrong way to color.
