A noun is a word that names a person, place, thing, or idea.

Verbs

A verb is a word that describes an action or a state of being.

Adjectives

An adjective is a word that describes a noun.

Adverbs

An adverb is a word that describes a verb, an adjective, or another adverb.

Pronouns

A pronoun is a word that takes the place of a noun.

Prepositions

A preposition is a word that shows the relationship between a noun (or pronoun) and other words in a sentence.

Conjunctions

A conjunction is a word that joins words, phrases, or clauses together.

Interjections

An interjection is a word that expresses strong emotion.
