Muhammad Ali, born Cassius Marcellus Clay Jr. on January 17, 1942, was an American professional boxer, activist, and philanthropist. He is widely regarded as one of the greatest boxers of all time. Ali became famous for his combination of speed, skill, and charisma inside and outside the boxing ring. He was a three-time world heavyweight champion and was known for his memorable bouts, such as those against Sonny Liston, Joe Frazier, and George Foreman.
