Aristotle

Aristotle was a Greek philosopher who lived from 384 to 322 BC. He is considered one of the most important figures in Western philosophy. Aristotle studied under Plato but went on to develop his own ideas and theories. His works cover a wide range of subjects, including logic, ethics, politics, metaphysics, and natural sciences. Aristotle believed in the importance of observation and experience. He often categorized knowledge and created a system of logic that is still taught today.
